- Legislation
- Demand from researchs councils

Contracts for data processing



Legislation

- Danish Archives Act
- The Act on Processing Personal Data



Demand from researchs councils

- Twice a year the Danish Research Councils donate money to research projects
- If research projects include data, they demand depositing at DDA



Contracts for data processing

- DDA Health
- Datasets of great importance to society
- Important datasets at risk of destruction
- Datasets with a large potential for reuse

The hard way

- Try to persuade a single researcher to deposit and share his/her data volunterily
 - The researcher is not aware of depositing and archiving data.
 - Depositing of data has no priority
 - It has never occurred to him or her that anyone else should benefit from his/her data



Conclusion

 It is preferable to lean on legislation or other formal agreements in acquisition of data

 But of course we are grateful when researchers volunteer to deposit their data
