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Phases of data acquisition

- Localization
- Assessing
- > 1st contact
- More information to depositors
- (Ingest)

Localization

- Sources: internet, e-mail lists, journals...
- Basic information about the localized data into the internal database TIIPII:
- what kind of data
- preliminary title
- potential depositor & e-mail address
- description of the contents

Assessing & first contact

- Two-women team goes through the localizations 3–4 times a year
- Five types of contact letters: first contact, reminder, first contact with former customers, congratulation letters
- E-mail "spamming": 50 e-mails, maybe 10 replies, or less

More information to depositors

- Depositors get another e-mail: long instructions what to send, how and to whom
- Some never manage to send their data, nowadays most of them do after getting the instructions
- Additional contacts to get missing material for data descriptions

Reasons for not depositing

- data does not exist
- exists, but is a mess, in an ancient format etc.
- very very confidential information
- promises made to research subjects

Reaction to refusal

- sometimes I just thank them and give up
- > sometimes I try to persuade: explain about anonymisation, reuse conditions, ethics...


Easy cases

- "old friends" = networks and connections count
- Researchers who need us for something
- Third sector organizations

Data policy effects

- Research funders' recommendations
- Demands for data management plans
- More contacts from the researchers to the archive since 2008
